#### **How to get the most out of your visit:**

- You may want to consider finding a battle viewing spot approximately 30 minutes before the battle begins. Look for signage at Blacksmith field (#37) and near Grist Mill (#40).
- The Freeman Farm area (#34 and #39), Pottery Shop (#32) and District School (#31) will be inaccessible to visitors between 1:15 - 3:00 p.m. due to the battle.

#### **Throughout the Day: Colonial Era Crafts & Displays:**

Join the Lebanon Towne Militia as they showcase everyday activities in camp with the soldiers and followers, demonstrate leather working, gourd carving and gunsmithing, play tabletop games of the 18<sup>th</sup> century and more (near the District School, Building #31).

#### **10:00 a.m. Church Service - The Reverend**

**Christopher Haydon:** The Worship Service is based on historical Judeo-Christian texts, but open to all. We will share inspiring hymns, period prayers, and a sermon on Faith and Freedom (in the Center Meetinghouse, #6).

**10:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. & 3:00 - 5:00 p.m. There are Spies Among Us:** Rumor has it the British Army is on the move. Assist the Continental Army's Intelligence officers as a spy - move through both friend and enemy camps, uncover British secrets, and discover where the army is heading next before time runs out! (Scavenger Hunt for Spies of All Ages) (in front of the Asa Knight Store, Building #10).

#### **10:30 a.m. & 12:30 p.m. Musket Demonstration:**

Watch our interpreters load and fire a flintlock musket (behind the Cabinetmaking Shop, Building #7).

**11:00 a.m. What Did They Wear?** Join some 18th century women as they show the many articles of clothing that are worn within typical households and across social classes of New England. Compare and discuss the various styles of women's clothing during the American Revolution. (in the Center Meetinghouse, #6).

**11:15 a.m. Learn to March:** Join Soldiers from the Allied Army (French & American) as they teach visitors how to maneuver together as a single unit (by the Allied Camp, Friends Meetinghouse).

#### **11:30 a.m. What Did They Wear? (British Edition):**

Come join Crown reenactors up at the Center Meetinghouse while they show off and discuss what was commonly worn by their officers and enlisted men. (in the Center Meetinghouse, #6).

**11:45 a.m. Tour of the British Camp** Learn how Soldiers, their wives, children, and other Followers lived while the Army was active on campaign. Check out tents, meal preparation, and more (meets at Thompson Bank, #19).

**1:00 p.m. Artillery Demonstration:** Come see and listen to the roar of the cannon as these powerful guns are fired into the sky (at the Blacksmith Field, #37).

**2:00 p.m. Battle: Redcoats vs Rebels** (*Weather permitting*) (at the Freeman Farm Fields, #34).

#### **3:15 p.m. Spirit of '76 Fife & Drum Music:**

Come listen to fife and drum music of the American Revolution performed by Lebanon Towne Militia's fife and drum corps Spirit of '76 (near the Center Meetinghouse, Building #6).

**3:30 p.m. Learn to March:** Join Soldiers from the British Army as they teach visitors how to maneuver together as a single unit (by the British Camp).
